









992 people responded to our survey

Over half of the public fall within the range of 30-49 years old.


Half of respondents identified as female, and nearly half as male.

How do you usually get here?









Many come to Powell Street to shop nearby in Union Square, to pass through the area, and to access MUNI/BART.

What are your typical reasons for visiting Powell Street?












The frequency of visiting Powell Street varies among respondents, with the majority visiting a few times a month.

How frequently do you come to Powell Street, between Market and Geary Street?








The majority (66%) typically stay for 1 hour or less in the Union Square area, while 29% will still stay half day or longer.






Many see Powell as a place to gather for retail, shopping, and dining, and festivities and celebrations.

What is Powell Street to you?










However, "Empty" and "Uninviting" are highly mentioned when describing Powell Street today, while also optimistically noting its a place attracting tourists, and its "Potential".

How would you describe Powell Street today?








People are excited to see the potential of this area to revitalize, and elevate its iconic and historic charm.

But we need to do better to bring vitality to the street.







What should Powell Street be in the future?




"A mix of all the above"



"Focus on local artist and brands!"

"Prioritize foot traffic and turn the streets into bike lanes. **De-prioritize the cars** running through the area."

"Bring Powell St back for San Franciscans"

"Theater/music/poetry festivals!"
